

- Choosing courses for next school year:
 - Most 9th graders will be placed in the 2-period block for language arts and social studies. They will also take year-long 9th grade science and a semester of health¹. Choose five additional semester classes. These classes will include math and world language--for those taking a world language. *Remember that a year-long course is really two courses—one per semester.*
 - Indicate your choices on this option sheet by checking the box and writing the course name and number in the appropriate grid. Please include alternate electives in the lower grid.
 - Students from outside Seattle Public Schools should have their current math teacher recommend correct math placement.
 - A checklist of graduation requirements is available in the course description document for 2010-2011 that is posted on the website: <http://www.rhsseattle.org>.
 - World Language: If you are starting a world language, please also list an alternate language on the alternate elective line.
 - Family and Consumer Science (FACS): In the FACS department, the independent living course is the prerequisite for nutrition or human development.
 - Lifeguarding: Students must be fifteen years old to take the lifeguarding class.
 - Music:
 - 9th grade students who were enrolled in middle school band or jazz band should sign up for 85–Cadet Band. Auditions are necessary for jazz band and jazz lab (an after-school, non-credit activity). Information about auditions is available on the RHS jazz website: www.rooseveltjazz.org. Auditions for incoming students (specific date depends on instrument) will take place in August in the Roosevelt band room. For symphonic band, please see Mr. Brown in September.
 - Auditions are necessary for symphony and chamber orchestra. Auditions for incoming students will be held June 14 & 15 after school. Call 252-4948 to make an appointment with Ms. Edwards. In the meantime, string players should sign up for 84–StringOrch. Other instrumentalists should sign up for 85–Cadet Band.
 - Drama:
 - The theatre tech classes are involved with producing all the plays and the annual musical: sets, costumes, tickets, lighting, sound, etc. For more information, please call 252-4864 to speak with Mr. Van Kempen. These classes qualify for occupational education credit or fine arts credit.
 - Experienced drama students who wish to enroll directly in drama II without the drama I prerequisite **must** email Mr. Van Kempen <ruvankempen@seattleschools.org> to arrange an audition.
 - Auditions are necessary for the musical cast. Auditions are held in early December. The schedule adjustment for 2nd semester will be made then.
- ❖ **ESL teachers will sign for ESL classes. Please call 252-4810 to arrange a conference with Ms. Sizer, the ESL Department chair, if you are a newly assigned ESL student.**
- ❖ **Special education students will be scheduled by the Special Education Department. Parents of students receiving special education services need to contact Chad Barnes, Special Education Department chair, at 252-4954, to schedule an intake appointment. This should take place as soon as possible. *Schedules cannot be developed until this meeting takes place.* We want to ensure that special education students have appropriate classes and services.**

¹ Students who opt to take a full year (two semesters) **each** of a world language and either drama or music may delay taking health. However, students still need health to graduate and the school cannot guarantee that the course will be available at Roosevelt to students in grades 10, 11, or 12.
